New Thinking on Old Safety Issues. Human workers are imperfect, which is why there's no magic bullet that will give you a safe workplace. But new research and thinking on human behavior, and how that translates into safety attitudes, is helping some generators get beyond the traditional platitudes.

Managing Multiple Generations in a Smooth-Running Plant. Generators have always had to make some changes as each new generation enters the power sector, but today's new workers are bringing with them attitudes and skills that challenge traditional plant management, for good and ill. Coal Combustion Residual Rule Compliance Strategies.

The Environmental Protection Agency's rule to regulate the disposal of coal combustion residuals as solid waste went into effect last fall. After digesting available solutions and technologies, here's what some experts consider the safest and most effective approaches to comply with the rule and protect the environment.

Inherent Risk and Best Practices for Mitigation Related to Bulk Power System Generation.
